## LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

### Más que una palabra de moda

Si pones los ojos en blanco ante la mención del término corresponsabilidad, probablemente se deba a que, en la Iglesia moderna, la corresponsabilidad se ha convertido en una especie de palabra de moda corporativa. A menudo se usa indistintamente con los conceptos de dotación financiera y voluntariado.

¿Qué hay de malo en apoyar monetariamente a tu parroquia? ¿Cuál es el problema de dar de tu tiempo en el servicio y el ministerio? Nada en absoluto, de hecho, todos deberíamos estar haciendo más de estas cosas.

Pero a medida que las hacemos, deberíamos estar haciéndonos constantemente las preguntas más importantes: ¿Por qué estoy haciendo esto? ¿Cómo estoy haciendo esto? ¿Para quién estoy haciendo esto?

Una donación a la escuela parroquial es una gran cosa. Pero idealmente, el donante habría hecho la donación independientemente de la posibilidad de nombrar el gimnasio de la escuela. Una voluntaria incansable que siempre encuentra tiempo para su parroquia ciertamente glorifica a Dios con su compromiso. Pero, ojalá, su compromiso fuera igual de entusiasta si supiera que no hay ninguna posibilidad de ser incluida en el boletín como Voluntaria del Mes.

Dios no conoce favoritos. La oración del fariseo en el templo no lo justificaba porque el fariseo no lo decía en serio como una oración. Su intención no era agradecer a Dios, su intención era llamar la atención sobre sus dones. Dios no rechazó el ayuno y los diezmos del fariseo, rechazó el espíritu con el que se ofrecían.

Dios desea transformarnos: nuestros corazones, nuestras almas, nuestras comunidades. Cuando damos de nosotros mismos, ya sea a través del dinero o del tiempo, él es honrado por el acto de dar, no por el regalo en sí mismo. Nunca debemos cometer el error de pensar que la corresponsabilidad es **“tiempo, talento y tesoro.”** La corresponsabilidad es el espíritu de ofrecer estos dones libremente.

### Sharing the Gospel

If you have ever thought that you were better than somebody else, you are not alone. Even grown-ups think that way sometimes. The truth is, you really are not better than anyone else. You sin. You make mistakes, just like other people do. No matter how big or how small you think your mistakes are, they still make God angry. Instead of looking down on other people, remember your own mistakes. Ask God to forgive you.

#### **Prayer**

Dear God, I am so sorry I ever thought I was better than anybody else. Please forgive me.

#### **Something to Draw**

Draw a picture of something you did wrong. Then draw a picture of yourself asking God to forgive you.

#### **Mission for the Week**

Ask everyone in your class to make cards for people in prison. Jesus knows when people are truly sorry for what they have done wrong. Jesus wants to forgive prisoners, just like he wants to forgive you.

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

### More Than a Buzzword

If you roll your eyes at the mention of the term stewardship, it's probably because, in the modern Church, stewardship has become something of a corporate buzzword. It's often used interchangeably with the concepts of financial endowment and volunteerism.

What's wrong with supporting your parish monetarily? What's the issue with giving of your time in service and ministry? Nothing at all, in fact — we should all be doing more of these things.

But as we do them, we should be constantly asking ourselves the all-important questions: Why am I doing this? How am I doing this? For whom am I doing this?

A donation to the parish school is a great thing. But ideally, the donor would have made the gift regardless of the ability to name the school gym. A tireless volunteer who always finds time for her parish certainly glorifies God with her commitment. But hopefully, her commitment would be just as enthusiastic if she knew there was no prospect of being written up in the bulletin as Volunteer of the Month.

God knows no favorites. The prayer of the Pharisee in the temple did not justify him because the Pharisee didn't really mean it as a prayer. His intent wasn't to thank God, his intent was to draw attention to his gifts. God did not reject the Pharisee's fasting and his tithes, he rejected the spirit in which they were offered.

God desires to transform us — our hearts, our souls, our communities. When we give of ourselves — either through money or through time — he is honored by the act of giving, not the gift itself. We should never make the mistake of thinking that stewardship is **“time, talent, and treasure.”** Stewardship is the spirit of offering these gifts freely.

### Saint Anthony Mary Claret | October 24

Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the **“spiritual father of Cuba.”** He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of 1868.

The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.
